

## Kettle to the Metal Beer Can Derby Rules

ALL CARS MUST PASS INSPECTION TO QUALIFY FOR THE RACE.

- Axles, wheels, and body shall be from the materials provided in the kit.
- Axles and wheels can not be adjusted
- Wheel bearings, washers, and bushings are prohibited
- Weight shall not exceed 5 ounces. The official race scale shall be considered final.
- The overall length shall not exceed 7 inches.
- The overall width of the car shall not exceed 2 3/4 inches.
- The overall height of the car shall not exceed 5 inches so that it fits under the finish line
- You must have a beer can and/or brewery theme to your design/car
- The wood provided in the kit must be used. The block may be shaped any way that is desired.
- The wheels supplied with the kit must be used. The wheels may not be adjusted in any way.
- The car must be freewheeling, with no starting devices.
- If, during a race, a car leaves the track without interfering with its opponent, it shall be considered to have ended its heat at that point.
- If, during a race, no car reaches the finish line on the track, the car which went the farthest in its lane shall be declared as the heat winner.
- If, during a race, a car leaves its lane and, in so doing, interferes with another racer, then the car at fault shall be declared to have lost the race heat.
- Only dry lubricants such as graphite or powdered teflon “white lube” will be allowed for lubricating the wheels. Lubricants may not foul the track.
